


Northey Street City Farm is a nonprofit community organisation situated on the banks of Brisbane's Breakfast Creek in Windsor.

More than 1500 exotic and native fruit trees, bushtucker plants, shrubs and ground covers have been planted on the four hectare farm site since its inception in April 1994.

The farm has been developed for people to enjoy and participate in using the principles of permaculture. It is also intended to be a

demonstration site where people of all ages can learn through practical, hands on experience.
